

PARKING ZONES

Parking without payment, pay and display, and permit zones are depicted on the Parking Plan overleaf.

ELIGIBILITY

Free and pay and display car parks: Members of staff, other persons employed on the campus, students resident off campus or visitors may park in the free car parks, or in the pay and display car parks and Blue Bay spaces having paid the appropriate charge.

Permits: Staff and non resident students may apply for an annual parking permit. The permit entitles the holder to park in all car parks, except short stay and car park 1/1A which is restricted for Gibbet Hill Staff. Car Park 2 is reserved for staff and students primarily working from Gibbet Hill, Car Park 14 for staff working at Westwood.

APPLICATION FOR ANNUAL PERMIT

To be submitted on line www.warwick.ac.uk/go/carparks including payment.

Staff: Have the option of monthly payments by authorising the University to deduct the charge in equal monthly installments from their pay. Non Academic staff who work 60% or less of a normal working week may purchase an Annual Permit at the reduced rate of £72.50. To be reviewed by Jan '09.

Students: Students must pay the annual fee on application.

WARWICK CAR SHARE

Car Pools have been suspended and are under review.

Staff wishing to take part in Warwick Car Share can find more details and how to register on Insite. Staff registered with the scheme and displaying the appropriate permits can park in the designated bays reserved for members of the share, making payment as required.

DISABLED DRIVERS

Registered Disabled Badge holders are offered the same benefits on the University campus as they have on the highway. There is no need to obtain a University disabled permit. We would ask that even though the badge holder can park on double yellow lines, that fire lanes and emergency exits are not blocked.

There are disabled parking spaces near all buildings on campus, and these should be used in preference.

Staff and Students who are temporary disabled, or are not Registered Disabled Badge holders should provide evidence to support their application.

RESIDENT STUDENTS

RESIDENT STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO BRING CARS ONTO CAMPUS EXCEPT:

(i) **Resident Student Permit Holders** - Permits are granted on exceptional grounds (academic and medical). Such permits entitle the student to park only in the designated car parks. Registration Documents and Driving Licences may be asked to be produced. Permit holders' cars parked anywhere else will be subject to the penalties listed below. Enquiries to University House.

(ii) **High secure parking on campus** - The basement of multi-storey Car Park 15 has been set aside as a high security parking zone for resident students who wish to bring their cars on campus. The fee to reserve a space in this car park is £530 per academic year. There are a limited number of spaces available. (see note on overnight parking). Enquiries to University House.

DISPLAY OF PERMIT

Parking permits must be clearly displayed on the passenger side of the front windscreen.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Overnight parking is permitted only to cars displaying a **Resident Student, Resident Staff** or **High security garaging permit**.

Resident Students with a parking permit can **ONLY** park overnight in car park 15 or the car park designated by University House car parking.

High security permit holders must park in Car Park 15 at all times. Cars parked overnight anywhere else on campus will be clamped.

REPLACEMENT VEHICLE

A new permit will be available through the web page www.warwick.ac.uk/go/carparks by amending the original application.

REFUNDS

On surrender of the permit to car parking at University House a refund can be arranged, but only on a termly basis.

ENFORCEMENT

It is an offence to park anywhere on campus other than in a designated parking space. Traffic Officers patrol the car parks to enforce University policy.

To enforce its parking rules a strict clamping operation is in force across the campus and the University may exact fines, fit wheel clamps, and tow vehicles away.

In 2008/2009 offences will attract the following fines:

For parking in a space without displaying a valid ticket or permit;

Parking in a non-designated space.....£25

Parking on double yellow lines, in loading bays, on grass verges:£30

Parking in a fire lane, or a space designated for

disabled drivers:£40

Overnight Parking.....£25

These fines will be charged for each 24 hours or part thereof.

The University may trace ownership and charge the associated cost to the offender in addition to the above fines.

Penalties can be settled at University House between 8.30am and 16.30pm by credit cards, cash or cheque, OR at the Security Gatehouse, 24 hrs a day by cash or cheque, OR at Rootes Reception, between 8.00am till 8.00pm (term time), 8.00am till 11.00pm (vacation), by credit cards, cash or cheque.

If a vehicle is clamped more than twice, the penalty will be doubled incrementally. Frequent offenders will be disciplined for breach of University regulations.

VISITORS

Departments may apply to University House for day permits for official visitors. The day permit will entitle the holder to park in any of the University car parks. Other visitors may park in designated parking spaces and should pay the appropriate charge.

STUDENT VISITORS

Parking can be arranged for an overnight student visitor but relevant vehicle information must be provided to University House Reception, when a temporary permit will be issued at a charge of £3 for one night and £5 for each subsequent consecutive night.

Only in exceptional circumstances will a resident be issued with an overnight parking pass for his vehicle, having obtained permission from University House Reception.
