

# **2018 Data Imports Update**

As of 07<sup>th</sup> March 2018, we have a total of 15,730 imported cases from 7 Ambulance Services. Please continue to keep up the good work.

#### **Protocol Amendment**

Protocol amendment 3 has been approved by HRA and given an implementation date of the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 2018. The main changes for attention are the update to our data management processes and the addition of AQI variables for NHS England.



# **Update - Current research using the OHCAO registry**

#### 1: Analysis of bystander CPR

The paper identifies the characteristics of neighbourhoods with high incidence of out-of-hospital cardiac access and low bystander cardiopulmonary resuscitation rates in England. The paper will shortly be submitted for publication.

#### 2: Attitudes to CPR Survey

We plan to conduct a second YouGov survey to look at numbers of members of the general public who are trained in CPR and PAD use and their levels of confidence in performing CPR and using PADs. A paper reporting the results of the 2017 survey will shortly be submitted.

#### 3. Sex inequalities

The objective of this study is to explore the difference in the number of resuscitation attempts observed between men and women suffering from out of hospital cardiac arrests. The analysis is ongoing.

#### 4. Pre hospital adrenaline administration for OHCA

An analysis on prehospital administration of adrenaline for out-of-hospital cardiac arrest in England and Wales is being conducted using the findings from the PARAMEDIC randomised controlled trial and the OHCAO registry. The paper is currently being drafted.

#### 5. OHCA in schools

An epidemiological observational study aiming to establish the incidence and demographics of school based out of hospital cardiac arrests. Identifying in particular, the number of schools in the West Midlands with an AED on site and the number of school-based AEDs which are known to the West Midlands Ambulance Service. Paper is currently under peer review.

#### 6. Critical care team study

The study aims to understand pre hospital critical care for out of hospital cardiac arrests. Does it work, how does it work and how much does it cost? This study is still in progress.

#### 7. OHCA in international airports

Addressing out of hospital cardiac arrest survival in international airports. A retrospective cohort. Paper currently under peer review.

#### **EuReCa Two**

We are currently reviewing the October-December 2017 data that we have received. There is still time to submit your data!

We are pleased to announce that EuReCA ONE received the Ian G. Jacobs Award for International Group Collaboration to Advance Resuscitation Science from the American Heart Association.
