DATA TRANSPARANCY STATEMENT

The University of Warwick and University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust are the sponsors for this study based in the United Kingdom. We will be using information from you in order to undertake this study and the University of Warwick will act as the data controller for this study. This means that we are responsible for looking after your information and using it properly. The University of Warwick will keep study data for a minimum of 10 years after the study has finished.

Your rights to access, change or move your information are limited, as we need to manage your information in specific ways in order for the research to be reliable and accurate. If you withdraw from the study prior to data analysis, we will remove the information about you that we have already obtained. If you withdraw from the study after data analysis we may not be able to remove the information about you. To safeguard your rights, we will use the minimum personally-identifiable information possible.

A University of Warwick researcher, with your permission, will collect information for the research study from you in accordance with our instructions.

The researcher will record your (or your relative's) name and NHS number and this record will be kept in the hospital in accordance with the hospital's confidentiality processes and will not be passed to the research team at the University of Warwick. This information will only be used to contact you about the study or to oversee the quality of the study. Certain individuals from the University of Warwick and regulatory organisations may look at sections of your (or your relative's) medical and research records to check the accuracy of the research study. The information from your interview will be transferred to the University's secure computer system and will not contain any identifiable information. Your interview information will be given a code in case the research team need to ask the hospital to contact you. When the study team analyse the information from your interview they will not be able to identify you (or your relative).

Your hospital will keep identifiable information about you from this study for a minimum of 10 years after the study has finished
