Introduction

Over the past few years there has been a massive increase in the literature related to social work practice and welfare issues connected with ethnic minority communities. In the early years of immigration, there were very few sources to which the practitioner could turn for information about the cultural background of potential clients. Indeed it would still appear that such information is still frequently necessary, it not being unknown for 'West Indian' to be confused with 'West African'. However, a reliance on descriptive works written in the earlier periods when immigration was significant (Barnes 1973, Croucher 1972, Ellis 1978, Fitzherbert 1967 for example) might well be misleading because of changes both in culture and the economy and in the nature of ethnic minority communities. Early immigrants are now approaching old age, and (rather belatedly) the literature has begun to recognise the needs of the elderly (RADAR 1985, Barker 1984, Bhalla and Blakemore 1981, Berry et al. 1981, Davies 1982, Glendenning 1979). There is therefore some hope that services may be tailored to needs before the current cohort now approaching retirement age require assistance. However, it has to be admitted that studies of the impact of training (Richards 1985) or of organisational response (ADSS/CRE 1978, Austin et al. 1984, Baker and Husband 1979) do not give much scope for complacency.

Perhaps the most encouraging sign - or it may be the thing which has most provoked a response from professional and academic writers - is the development of community based groups (BBC 1985, Brah 1978, Chattey 1983, John 1978). These organisations have put pressure on the official services for reforms in training (Fisher and Day 1983, Editorial 1983) and provision, and have gone some way towards encouraging utilisation of services or the development of alternative provision.

In examining the development of service use - a topic which is under-researched even in the context of the wider white community (Jackson, 1979; Sainsbury 1979), there would seem to be a value in discussing the role of advice agencies which frequently act as referral sources (Markopolou 1974, NACAB 1983, McGrath 1976). The problem, however, is perhaps one of deciding where to start. The field of social welfare provision is a vast area, which may be approached from a variety of perspectives, with reference to particular care groups, in many different specific service sectors and through in many cases more than one agency.

This bibliography has attempted to classify some of the perceived categories of material encountered, and it is apparent that even if the material available is as good as it could be, there is still considerable scope to fill lacunae in information. There is, for example, a lack of examination of the question of adoption and fostering among Asian communities (excepting perhaps McCulloch et al. 1978) or perhaps an assumption that the

question never arises. Another question which may not be asked is that of the 'welfare' role of police-related work and probation staff, although Pinder (1982, 1983) and Taylor (1981) have attempted to put this on the agenda. Equally, of course, some areas have been very heavily examined - in particular the adoption and fostering of Afro-Caribbean children (ABAF 1977, CRC 1975, DHSS 1979, Ellis, Fitzherbert 1967, etc) and this question, while still apparently unresolved, may have served to stereotype or stigmatise the group to its more general disadvantage (Gibson 1979). Indeed, there is evidence that one such study (Gill 1983) had an effect in stimulating the response of black professionals in social work (Editorial 1983).

The organisation and funding of voluntary agencies has been given more attention recently (Mackie 1981, Wilson 1981) following pressures to 'privatise' care or to hand over reputedly specialist functions (such as the care of ethnic minorities!) to such agencies (John 1982) - but the relationship of such agencies to central provision requires to be established. Other minority communities (the Chinese, Travellers) have only been given sparse attention (Butler 1983, Chan 1983, Lim 1980, Lynn 1982) and there is surprisingly little beyond the work of Pearl and some advocacy or pressure groups (in which we include NACAB and JCWI - Wilkins 1985) on the legal aspects of social welfare. Of course, it is a developing area of concern - although one might legitimately ask why it has taken so long for the caring services to examine their response in this area. Writers in other fields, such as health or education, certainly believed that the social work services could provide them with models of practice and theory, but this has seldom been fulfilled. The majority of material comes from articles, frequently short, in professional journals, and there is little outside the work of Cheetham (1972, 1981, 1982) or Connelly (1981, 1985) and the articles of Sharma Ahmed (1978, 1982, 1983) which could be said to form a "corpus" of literature on the topic. The CRE has, of course, published a number of helpful booklets which may be read by those who have a particular interest in race-related issues and BASW (1978, 1982) and the short-lived Association for Multi-Racial Social Work have attempted to improve professional awareness, but it is noteworthy that generic textbooks (such as Mays 1983) still manage largely to avoid discussion of multi-racial or anti-racist social work.

Nonetheless, from the activities of pressure groups, the experiences of the 1981 disturbances (John 1982) and the interest of particular individuals (e.g. Liddiard 1980) it is evident that the profession, and academics studying or teaching in the field, have increasingly begun to take on board the realisation of a multi-racial, multi-cultural community. This has led to a degree of introspection about practice and training (ADSS 1983, 1985) which can only be helpful, and perhaps also towards a start in the reassessment of welfare practice (Nixon 1983, Ahmed 1983) which may have value in the wider field. Given the present-day trends towards the reorganisation of welfare benefits

(Cmd 9517-9: Reform of Social Security - which hardly mentions ethnic minority needs except the translation of one leaflet) and of welfare practice organisation (ongoing in many authorities, with local offices and family centres), it would be regrettable if the opportunity to learn from past mistakes was not grasped. It is also probable that a service more carefully geared to meeting the specific cultural needs of particular ethnic minority groups and combatting the general impact of racial disadvantage (Little and Robbins 1982) would prove to be more successful generally in tackling the problems of all its clients.
