Guesthouses are generally cheaper than hotels; however, you might want to check out Hylands Hotel, which seems to have interesting rates. All listed options are near to Coventry's train station and to the relevant bus routes – except Britannia Hotel, which is right in front of Coventry's bus station Pool Meadow (it may be convenient if you are travelling by coach).

On-campus accommodation:

Warwick Campus has three options: *Arden*, *Radcliffe*, *Scarman* (from the least to the most fancy). To book, the best thing to do is refer to the Warwick Conferences website and/or email them directly.

- ▶ **Eating & drinking:** Refreshments and caffeine will be provided throughout the conference. A sandwich lunch will also be provided. Please refer to MindGrad 2012 website to book the conference dinner. In case you want to take arrangements on your own, here and here are a couple of useful webpages. All pubs/cafés/restaurants are within walking distance; the most convenient ones are probably the Humanities and the Library Cafés. Warwick philosophers' favourite hangout on campus is the Dirty Duck; we will surely be happy to escort you there.
- ▶ **Registration:** If you are not a Warwick student or a speaker, you need to register in order to attend the conference. You are also required to pay an attendance fee of £20, which will cover the refreshment costs. However, for the first 30 registrations 50% of the attendance fee will be covered by the Analysis Trust, and 25% by Warwick Philosophy Department. Please refer to MindGrad 2012 website to register.
