

Dr Nitasha Kaul is a Kashmiri novelist, academic, poet and economist who lives in London. She has published widely in several groundbreaking collections and addressed diverse audiences around the world on many themes with a central focus on identity, democracy, creativity, political economy, Kashmir and Bhutan. She has an MSc (Econ) with a specialisation in Public Policy and joint PhD in Economics and Philosophy (2003) from the UK. With her multidisciplinary work, she was earlier a tenured Professor of Economics in Bristol, is a Fellow in Politics and International Relations at Westminster in London, and has also been an Associate Professor of Creative Writing in Bhutan. She has authored books including the scholarly monograph 'Imagining Economics Otherwise' (Routledge, 2007/2008), and a novel 'Residue' (Rainlight, 2014) that was shortlisted for the Man Asian Literary Prize in 2009. She has delivered invited lectures and keynotes at universities around the world (Stanford, Harvard, Goethe-Frankfurt, California-Berkeley, Oxford, Cambridge, Leiden, ANU, Goteborg), speaks to creative gatherings and the media (such as at literary events, OpenDemocracy, Guardian, BBC, Monocle 24, Kindlemag.in), and has addressed forums including the UN in New York.
