
The Herbert Art Gallery & Museum is pleased to welcome visual artist Lesley Whelan and mathematician Adam Boddison to look back on their collaboration Equate. This seminar is open to artists, students and anyone interested in the interplay between fine art and other disciplines.



Lesley Whelan is a Midlands based visual artist who studied art in Birmingham and now works from a studio in Coventry. Lesley's focus on plants led to her being awarded Artist in Residence at Winterbourne Botanic Garden at Birmingham University in 2003. Through Equate Lesley sought a further challenge, exploring how different mathematical concepts could develop her artistic practice.



In April 2009 Lesley and Adam held a seminar which allowed the public to see their journey so far – the wide-ranging theories they explored and the challenges they faced to translate these into art. Since then, the questions kept coming and the journey took more unexpected turns, but the art eventually won through.



This seminar will explore some fascinating questions about collaborative practice, the nature of expertise and the creative process.
