"Sailors of Cattaro" is by Friedrich Wolf. It is a play about the revolt in the Austrian navy in 1918, when 6,000 sailors of the Imperial Fleet overpowered their officers, and ran up the Red Flag in a brave attempt to stop the World War. It will be produced by Andre Van Gyseghem, of the Embassy Theatre. Recent events in Austria give an added interest to a play which is already exciting and moving.
