

Classics

The Classics collection has been actively developed since the early years of the University, and with the foundation of the Department of Classics and Ancient History, the range of specialised subject areas became directly related to the University's teaching and research. There are good collections in Greek and Latin literature, history and art, with runs of scholarly periodicals to correspond with the subjects covered by the book stock.

The Library's main strengths are in Greek and Roman drama, Greek and Roman lyric and epic poetry, the classical and Hellenistic periods of Greek history, the provinces of the Roman Empire (e.g. Britain and Egypt), the later Roman emperors and the establishment of Christianity. There is much additional material in the fields of archaeological and artistic evidence, e.g. Greek and Roman pottery, coins, inscriptions, buildings and sculpture.

The key to the Library's book and periodical stock is the web catalogue, although in some cases further details of older materials can be found in the card catalogue. Information about articles and research papers in classical subjects can be found online in *L'Année Philologique*. It is also available in printed form and as a CD-ROM as the *Database of Classical Bibliography*.
