## Trapassato prossimo (past perfect)

- The trapassato prossimo is a tense that is used to express what you had done.
- By the time you arrived we had already finished =
- In Italian, the *trapassato prossimo* is formed as follows:
- the imperfect of the auxiliary of the verb
  + the past participle of the verb

Io avevo visto (I had seen)

Io ero stato (I have been)



## Passato remoto\* (historical past)

- Il passato remoto is used when recounting historical events
- Il passato remoto conveys a sense of detachment, and for this reason it is mostly used in the third person singular or plural
- The passato remoto describes an action which took place at a particular time in the past
- The passato prossimo is more widely used in contemporary writing and in spoken Italian
