Malawi (DFID)	OldAge Pension	\$75 (US\$ 100)

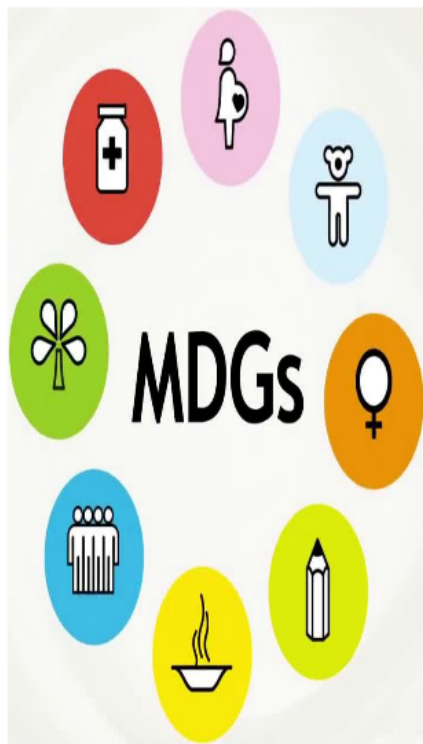

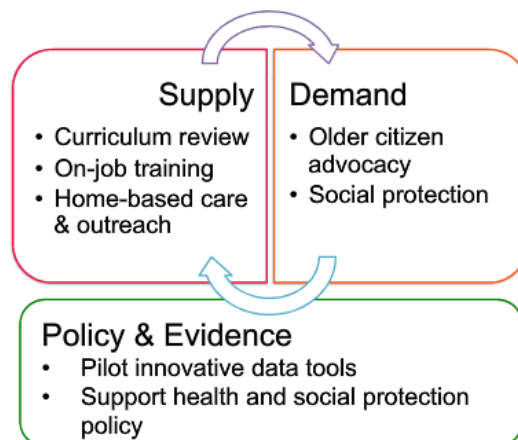

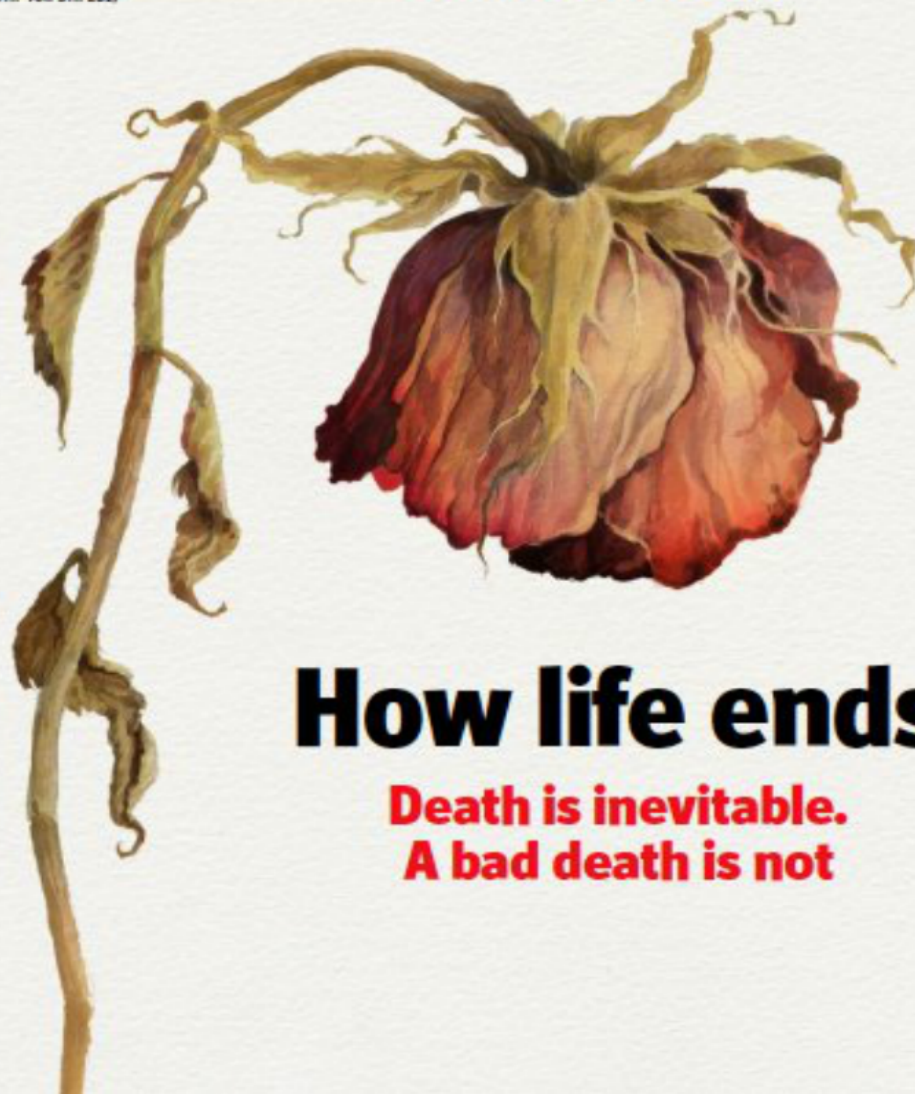
